1. Basic information

1.1	Partner organization and country: VIKO, Lithuania
1.2	Date of the event: March 20th, 2025
1.3	<i>Number of participants</i> : total 35 (19 on site, 16 online) Evaluation form was filled by 15 participants.
1.4	Participants profile: Trainers and lecturers from different Lithuanian education institutions, business representatives, students.

2. Feedback on the InnoSocial Dissemination Event organization

The event location was rated very positively – all respondents marked "Very Good," indicating a high level of satisfaction.

The registration process also received mostly positive ratings:

"Very Good" – 11 times, "Good" – 3 times, "Not Applicable" – 1 time.

This suggests that the registration process was well organized, although it might not have been relevant to some respondents.

3. Feedback on the InnoSocial Dissemination Event overall satisfaction

Based on the responses to the third evaluation question, it can be concluded that the event was rated positively by the majority of participants. The content of the event received mostly "Very Good" ratings, with only two cases marked as "Good." The value of the information presented was also rated positively – the vast majority of responses were "Very Good," except for one case marked as "Good." The practical applicability seemed to be of high quality for most participants, although three responses were marked as "Good." The presentation of the InnoSocial project was rated as "Very Good" by almost everyone, with only one case marked as "Good." The presentation of the project results also received mostly "Very Good" ratings, with only two cases marked as "Good." The questions and discussions section were rated somewhat more variably – most participants chose "Very Good," but four responses were "Good," indicating that, while the discussions were useful, some may have found them less detailed or engaging. The overall event rating was exceptionally high – most participants marked it as "Very Good," but a few choose "Good."

The event content, provided information and presentations were rated extremely well. The majority of participants were satisfied with both the presentations and their practical applicability. The questions and discussions section received the fewest positive ratings, but it was still rated positively overall. This indicates that the event was organized with high quality and met the participants' expectations.







4. Feedback on the InnoSocial Dissemination Event impact and follow-up

4	<u>Did the event meet your needs and professional practice requirements?</u> All respondents answered "Yes," which indicates that the event fully met the participants' expectations and professional needs.
5	Did the event provide you with an opportunity to learn new things about inclusive innovation and social entrepreneurship education and training? All participants answered "Yes," confirming that the event provided new knowledge in this area.
6	Are the results of the "InnoSocial" project useful, applicable, and transferable into practice? All responses were "Yes," indicating that the project results are practical and can be applied in real-world activities.
7	Would you recommend the results of the "InnoSocial" project to your colleagues or fellow students? Most participants answered "Yes," but one respondent chose "No." This indicates a high, but not complete consensus on this matter.
8	Do you think that the "InnoSocial" learning materials and tools can help you develop skills in the field of social entrepreneurship and/or skills that will enhance your ability to create and teach social business? All respondents answered "Yes," indicating that the learning materials are valuable and useful for developing their competencies.
9	Which project deliverable(s) you believe is/are most useful for you and/or your organization (tick all relevant)
	The Inclusive Innovation and Social Entrepreneurship course – 11 mentions The "Lessons Learned" and "Success Stories" collection – 9 mentions The "InnoSocial" educational development and implementation tools collection – 8 mentions Participants most often indicated the training course as the most useful project result (11 selections). However, the other two tools – the "Lessons Learned" and "Success Stories" collection (9 selections) and the tools collection (8 selections) – also received high ratings. This suggests that all project results were valuable and useful for different audiences, and participants see them as applicable in their work.
10	Please, share any additional comments either about the InnoSocial deliverables or about the event.
	Participants' feedback on the InnoSocial, project results and event were extremely positive. The majority highlighted the quality and usefulness of the event, emphasizing that the project results are highly applicable in practice. Some participants noted that they were impressed by the students' presentations, as well as the project's concept and its application possibilities within integrated IB activities. It was also mentioned that the speeches from social entrepreneurship representatives and the student presentations were very motivating. Participants expressed gratitude for the well-organized event and were pleased to see the
	practical applicability of the project results both in their businesses and in youth education. The event's topic was considered very relevant and valuable, especially in promoting the







spread of social entrepreneurship ideas. Some participants did not respond to this question.















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
